Running The Numbers

Visitors to the Library

33,760 people visited the library last year. That is **650** visitors a week.

Items Checked Out

29,075 items were checked out. That includes **2,251** eMaterials, **5,144** dvds, & **17,180** books.

Items Added to the Library

2,236 items were added worth **\$34,400** including **261** kids books, **800** adult books & more.

Interlibrary Loan

463 items were sent to our library and **393** items were sent to other libraries.

Programs

98 library programs with over **1,600** attendees and over **1,000** of the attendees were kids.

Summer Reading

Over **350** kids participated in the Summer Reading program.

Community Meeting Room

The Community Meeting Room was used over **250** times last year, nearly **5** times a week.


Did You Know...

Individuals with mobility issues can sign up for delivery with our **Homebound Delivery** program.



Expenses



